



Oral Health Management of Patients at Risk of Medication-related Osteonecrosis of the Jaw: Research Audit

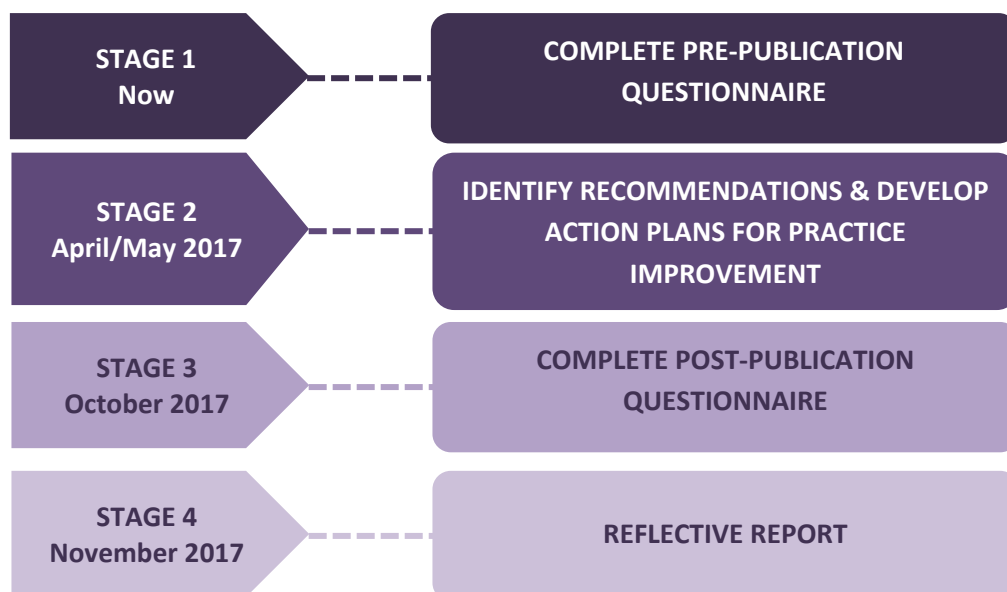
Background

In line with the new arrangements for clinical audit as described in the CDO letter of 17 January 2014, dentists who complete this questionnaire may be eligible for **three hours of research audit credit**. Participation in research audit can now count for up to five hours of clinical audit credit in any three year audit cycle. General Dental Practitioners will be able to claim Clinical Audit Allowance in respect of their Research Audit Hours.

What do I have to do?

To be eligible for research audit credit you must complete the enclosed questionnaire and return it in the FREEPOST envelope provided. Six months following publication of SDCEP's MRONJ guidance you will be asked to complete the questionnaire again. You will also be asked to develop action plans and complete a reflective report. Below is a summary of the steps involved:



STAGE 1: Complete the pre-publication questionnaire.

STAGE 2: On publication of the guidance, identify three recommendations included in the questionnaire where your practice could be improved, develop action plans for improvement and implement these.

STAGE 3: Complete the post-publication questionnaire.

STAGE 4: Complete a reflective report, which includes reflections on each of the recommendations identified in Stage 2, along with your overall reflections from participating in this study.
